The 5th Asia Pacific Symposium on Emotions in Worklife* is being hosted and sponsored by the UQ Business School, The University of Queensland, Brisbane, Australia. The symposium is a day-long, meeting of scholars interested in the study of emotions in work.

The format of the symposium will include a keynote address by an internationally renowned emotions scholar, and will feature paper presentations as well as roundtable sessions to discuss poster presentations. Morning tea and lunch will be provided to all participants, and the conference will conclude with a dinner. (Please indicate whether you are interested in staying for dinner in your covering email when you submit your paper.)

There is no registration fee for attending the symposium. (If you attend the dinner, this will be at your expense and paid for separately.)

Submission Guidelines

Three types of submissions are sought: Oral presentations, poster sessions, and group proposals.

Submissions for the roundtable (Poster) session require an abstract of between 200 and 400 words describing your project/paper, as well as the paper title, author(s), affiliations, and contact details. Posters will be discussed briefly in moderated roundtable sessions following poster viewing. In keeping with the roundtable format, we welcome papers describing work in progress or developmental papers. A small number will be selected for oral presentation.

Group proposals are welcome. Examples include an innovative panel, hot topic discussion session, or short symposium. Group proposals should provide a 400 to 800 word outline of the topic including a short description of each member's contribution. The key criterion in evaluating group proposal is that they provide an efficient way to use our limited time in a way that provides the most benefit to participants in advancing their research.

Submit your abstract or proposal as an MS Word file (.doc or .docx), with double-spaced text and 12pt TR font to the Editor, Dr. Oluremi (Remi) Ayoko r.ayoko@business.uq.edu.au. All accepted abstracts/proposals will be published in the conference proceedings.

Travel Support Scholarships:

Doctoral students submitting papers to the symposium may also wish to apply for a *Travel Support Scholarship* (up to \$500 per successful application). A limited number of scholarships are available and will be assessed based on individual need and the quality of the paper submission. To apply for a Travel Support Scholarship, please provide an abstract of approximately 1000 words in MSWord format (.doc or .docx) to Dr. Ayoko. Please include a title, author(s), affiliations, and contact details within the document.

In submitting for a scholarship, please include a brief statement in your email outlining how a scholarship would assist you to attend the symposium. Please also ensure that you insert “**APSEW Travel Support Scholarship Application**” in the email subject heading.

The closing date for the travel scholarships is **Friday 15th October, 2010**.

Travel Scholarship applicants will be notified of their acceptance by Friday 29th October, 2010. All accepted papers will be published in the Symposium Book of Abstracts.
